Higher Thresholds for Ethics Reports

"With the advent of this New Year, higher reporting threshold amounts will come into play when filing various ethics reports. If you or someone you know files campaign finance, lobby, or personal finance reports, among others, there are new thresholds that went into effect on January 1, 2020. The Texas Ethics Commission rule, § 18.31, and the applicable thresholds can be found here. The semiannual reports being filed on January 15 are under the old rules. If you follow the old rules, you will still be in compliance, so don't worry if it takes you a while to get used to the new thresholds. An example: Lobbyists are to report gifts to legislators and there are thresholds applicable to when that legislator's name is detailed. Under Texas Government Code § 305.0061(c)(3), that threshold was \$50. It is now \$90. If you still file at the lower threshold, you are in compliance.
